Accountants

Identify, measure, analyze, interpret and communicate financial information used by management to plan and execute activities.

Contract Specialists

Conduct market research, prepare statements of work development, select appropriate contract types, negotiate/administrate contracts and investigate financial assistance for services and supplies in support of BPA programs.

Cost Analysts

Gather, extract, review and consolidate a variety of task orders including cost, statistical and narrative data for subcontracting design services. You will also ensure project schedules are met; monitor expenditures by project, contract, and project manager; develop and maintain databases and suspense logs, extracting data to provide to managers.

Pre-Schedulers

Establish transmission pre-schedules of hydroelectric power usage involved with reserving and assigning power or transmission increments of time and volume. Analyze actual transmission transactions to develop daily after-the-fact transmission transaction reports; coordinate AC/3rd AC/DC line reductions and outages on Interties and associated facilities with power interchange requirements; assure transmission schedules are in accordance with applicable contracts for sale, purchase, and transfer of transmission over the Federal Columbia River Transmission System; maintain and develop transmission transaction accounts for all sales, purchases, and special transactions; recommend changes in existing procedures and develop new procedures to accomplish after-the-fact scheduling transactions.

Duty Schedulers

Work with hydroelectric power usage and be involved with reserving and assigning power or transmission increments of

time and volume, establish, develop, and execute real-time high-voltage transmission schedules based upon contractual agreements; analyze the availability of transmission capacity to fulfill reservation requests; track/account for the electricity transmitted across BPA's system; interpret contract language into operational plans to ensure contractual compliance; develop and maintain records relative to transmission transaction accounting; and resolve discrepancies and disagreements.

Financial Analysts/Specialists

Identify, measure, analyze, prepare, interpret and communicate financial information used by management to plan and manage activities and monitor appropriate use of BPA's resources.

Human Resources Specialists

Opportunities in Human Resources for Staffing and Placement, Employee Relations or Learning and Development.

Program Analysts

Manage individual programs, track and issue inventory items, place orders, troubleshoot, analyze contracts and costs, distribute costs to user organizations, audit records, verify and certify invoices, track payments and year-to-date expenditures and coordinate basic contract renewals.

Public Affairs Specialists

Act as a liaison between BPA and local Indian tribes, customers, government officials, and the public promoting agency and employee understanding of BPA and issues related to implementation of policies, building partnerships based on common goals, and fulfilling responsibilities.
